

What a great success the Later Years SRC students were at the Joanne Ryan SRC forum last week. A huge well done and thank you to Teddy, Yahya, Laura, Bayli, Konphil, Oliver and Ryder for representing the school and being our voice to the greater community.

Upon arrival students had to navigate an unfamiliar space, introduce themselves to three other people in the room and then present About our school. Everyone brainstormed the key trends, issues, values, role and structures at our school and then Laura, Teddy and Oliver presented to other mainstream secondary schools. A great achievement by these students who were so articulate in sharing our message.

Students then discussed when they have had to implement change and what strategies they used. Strategies included listening, leading by example, role modelling, actioning our words, and sticking to our goals. Students were then faced with an issue of how they would support a student who was feeling disconnected from school, their approaches included talking and listening and introduce them to different people. Students knew if we got this right attendance would improve and school would be safer place for all. I was so proud of these students and their commitment to school improvement. I look forward to taking more students to SRC forums throughout the year.

As we prepare for the annual Attitudes to School survey students in grades 4-12 have participated in a short scale survey set by the school and there were such pleasing results with 94% of students in grades 4-6 saying yes, they have been shown different ways to regulate. Only 56% of students said that they keep trying even if the work is hard. We are going to look at bump it up walls to support students with learning resilience. Opt in forms will be sent home in the coming weeks.

Curriculum update - Later years

Both Later Years campuses have celebrated 50 Days of School by engaging in a Maths Championship Day. The days were full of Numeracy learning experiences and student feedback has been very positive.

Our Later Years Professional Learning Communities (PLC) are continuing to implement their learning from Top Ten Maths in the classroom, which is showing a positive impact on student learning. The PLCs are also focusing on Comprehensive Literacy Instruction and currently identifying our emergent and conventional readers and writers so learning can be differentiated to meet the individual learner's needs.

Post school bus tours will take place in Week 4, these tours give families and students an opportunity to visit post-school service facilities in person.

Our Work-Related Skills group have been applying their numeracy knowledge to make homemade cleaner, which we will be selling at the Cayley's Road night Market later this year. Our Music group have been using the Application Garage Band and percussion instruments to make relaxation songs to share with our classes across the campus.
