Learning

Despite the rain, this term has started off well with students launching right into their learning from day 1. In the primary years, students have been identifying special events and planning celebrations. As the year draws to a close, there will be various celebrations at school that students can plan and participate in. Students in the secondary years have continued with their science inquiry with an emphasis on hands on learning. We look forward to the yearly night market at CRC and the BRC celebration day later this term.

A reminder that we are a sun smart school. This means that students are required to wear a hat when outside during breaks.

Professional Learning

Over the school break, five staff members attended a 5-day comprehensive Literacy PL in Queensland. The PL explored evidence-based approaches to support all students with disabilities to read, write and communicate. The PL was attended by Kim Zammit (Assistant Principal), Nimi Goh (speech therapist), Maddy Slatkin (Leading Teacher), Stacey Hilder (Leading Teacher) and Olivia Galizi (teacher). We are looking at engaging with the facilitators of this PL to provide in-school support for implementation of comprehensive literacy at Warringa Park School in 2024.

Pupil Free Days

Please note that Monday 6 November is a pupil free day. Our staff will be attending a whole day professional Learning facilitated by Berry Street. The Berry Street Model helps educators gain new perspective, strategies and skills to build safer, healthier and more engaging classrooms for all learners. Our school has committed to four days training on this model over the next two years. Berry Street also provides training and support for carers and families. Parking at school

A reminder to families that parking in the following areas is prohibited:

Sensory Stepping-Stones with Werribee Gymnastics Club

Werribee Gymnastics' Sensory Stepping Stone Program is designed for gymnasts with different neuro-diversity. We cater for Autism Spectrum Disorder, ADHD, Sensory Integration Disorder, Developmental Delay and children who need extra support for participation. The program is designed by an experienced gymnastics coach and an Occupational Therapist and taught by specialty trained gymnastics coaches.

Our class program on Sunday mornings runs:

- 9 to 10am: SSS3 This class caters for children who require substantial support. Parents are encouraged to participate to help manage behaviour and the coaches will take care of the rest. We recommend this class for children with a diagnosis of ASD Level 3.
- 10.15 to 11.15am: SSS2 This class caters for children who require moderate support. Parents are encouraged to be nearby. We recommend this class for children with a diagnosis of ASD Level 2.
- 11.30am to 12.30pm: SSSI This class caters for children who require minimum support but will cope better in a quieter and more supported learning environment. We recommend this class for children with a diagnosis of ASD Level 1.

To make these sessions neuro diversity friendly we have included a number of modifications. Not sure which class is best for your child? Get in touch and have a chat with our resident OT! Places are limited to ensure low child to coach ratios.

Providing all children with an opportunity to participate in gymnastics is important to us at Werribee Gymnastics. Where possible we will include children with a disability into our mainstream programs, however, this is not always the right choice for all children. Therefore we offer a number of different programs that we hope will assist all children to participate in gymnastics.

Dear Families.


I always find Term 4 extremely enjoyable as it gives us the opportunity to celebrate all the learning that has taken place over the year!


The work that has been undertaken this year in teaching and learning has been very successful and this was reflected in the results of the Staff Opinion survey.

Professional learning targeted to improve literacy & numeracy achieved a positive endorsement of 94% from staff. It was very pleasing that Planning differentiated learning activities achieved an 88% positive endorsement and that Collaborating to plan curriculum achieved 87% from staff. Our data in all areas of teaching and learning in the Staff Opinion survey has improved compared to last year which is real cause for celebration. The survey has assisted us to identify that the area of Practice Improvement should be our focus next year.

This term students will be undertaking a unit of Inquiry which will focus on Celebrations. The concept of a celebration has been introduced across the school with many classes planning and throwing a birthday party for one of the school's 3 PBIS mascots. Group 18 planned a surprise party for Wally the Working Together Wombat. In order to throw the party, they undertook a great deal of planning using their literacy and numeracy skills as is illustrated in the photos of the work below. They came up with a list of what they needed for the celebration, researched the cost of each item and added up the total needed to purchase the party supplies. They also baked a cake following the steps in the recipe to ensure it was a success. Wally even attended the party and got a great surprise when he entered the room! Great work Group 18!
















Curriculum update - Later years

During the school holidays 5 staff members attended the Literacy for All Intensive course with Jane Farrell in Coomera, QLD. The 5-day instructional course covered theoretical and practical aspects of Comprehensive Literacy Instruction for children with a disability, including complex communication needs. Teachers learned about Literacy practices for both emergent and conventional readers and writers and were provided with access to several practical resources.

Later this week, we will meet with the Learning Consultants to discuss an implementation plan across our four campuses, based on the data we have gathered.

Teachers at Bethany Road have continued to moderate writing work samples to assist with their planning, at student point of need. This targeted approach has seen several students make growth with their writing.

At Cayleys Road, the teachers have been using their Letter ID Assessments to identify where students sit on the Guidelines for Teaching – Letters, Sounds and Words. This data has been created into a Data Wall for students from Year 7 – 10. During PLC meetings, the teachers are using the data wall to plan learning experiences for students using evidence-based teaching strategies.

Students in the Victorian Pathways Certificate are completing their final learning outcomes, which are due to be entered into VASS no later than 13th November. Results will be delivered to the school on December 11th. VET courses will begin to finish for the year from Friday 20th October.

A note from the school nurses

We have now entered term 4 and are on the home straight! We have had a great response in receiving updated management plans, so thank you all for getting them in. All Management Plans need to be updated yearly. This information is instrumental to ensure that your child is receiving the best care that we can provide here at school.

COVID-19

There is still Covid present in the community and at school. We recommend that if your child is showing signs of Covid that you test them please.

• Signs present as temperature above 37.5, runny nose, cough, sneezing, feeling unwell, not wanting to eat.

The policy remains the same regarding Covid positive students. Students who test positive are to remain at home for 5 days from the day of the positive test. Before returning to school, the student needs to be asymptomatic. This means, no temperature or signs of Covid. The student needs to be eating and drinking. The student needs to have a negative RAT test result the morning of their return.

Parents will be notified if their child has been in contact with a Covid positive student.

Please do not send your child to school if they have symptoms of Covid.

Gastro

We have also had Gastro going around the Warringa Crescent Campus. If your child has diarrhoea twice at school, they will be sent home. Students must stay home for 48 hours after their last episode of diarrhoea when they have Gastro.

Specialist update - Visual Arts

This Term in Visual Arts we are learning about Art connected to celebrations in different cultures.
