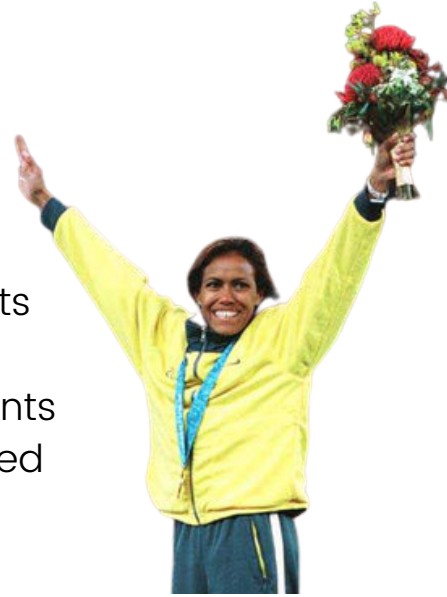
Warringa Park Co-curricular news

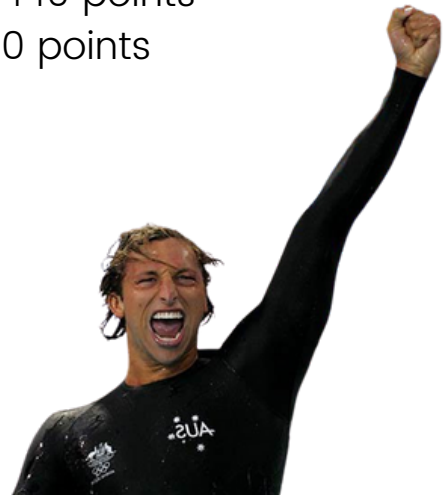

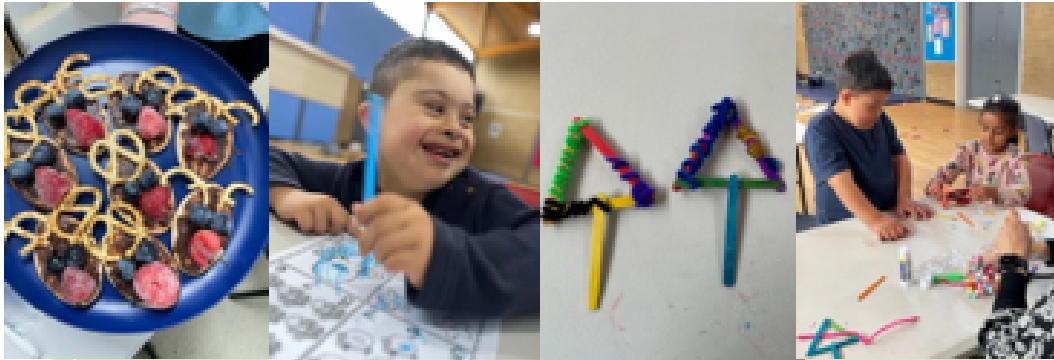
