## Principal's Newsletter

Dear Parents and Carers,

We look forward to your attendance at the Student Support Group (SSG) Meetings conducted across week 9. This time is devoted to teachers sharing with parents and carers the academic and social priorities for your child. Teachers may also utilise this time to elaborate on safety and engagement strategies to support your child's learning. For the Senior Years students, the SSG also provides important context around how the learning priorities are modified to support students with the skills, knowledge and competencies required for their post-school pathways. Your child's Individual Education Plan (IEP) or Educational Career Action Plan (ECAP) will be posted on compass next Friday. Please take some time to look at the goals identified by your child's teacher as a priority and feel free to discuss your perspective during the SSG meeting.

Bookings for SSG can be made through Compass. Please discuss with your class teacher if you have trouble accessing the booking form or if you are not available for SSG meeting in week 9. Your child's teacher may provide other times that they could be available for the meeting. With the implementation of Disability Inclusion Profile (DIP) in 2023, an SSG meeting and SSG meeting notes are pre-requisites for Disability Inclusion meetings for all students. Disability Inclusion meetings which are facilitated by an independent facilitator, help us to better understand what our students need and what support is required to help them learn and participate at school. It involves:

- a new Disability Inclusion Profile and school funding model to strengthen support for students with disability.
- more resources, training and coaching for our teachers and school staff about the best ways to support students with disability.

The Disability Inclusion Profile helps us identify the strengths, needs and adjustments we can make to assist students' learning, participation, and engagement at school. The Disability Inclusion Profile replaces the Program for Students with Disabilities (PSD) application process. Over the coming years, we will continue to invite families of students who are currently part of the PSD, and other students with disability and additional learning needs to participate in a meeting to complete a Disability Inclusion Profile. We will invite the families of identified students to participate in this process in 2024 and beyond. If you are involved, you will receive a letter, information package and consent form late next week. The consent must be completed and returned to the school prior to the end of term. We will use school funding and supports provided through Disability Inclusion for more training and professional development for teachers and school staff, expert advice about disability, employing new teachers and other staff to help plan and deliver adjustments for students and resources to support learning. The new Disability Inclusion approach ensures our school is

better able to support students with disability and additional learning needs. Warringa Park School is excited to be part of Disability Inclusion and we look forward to continuing to support our students to learn and thrive. # School Wide Positive Behaviour Supports (SWPBS)

Last week an SWPBS community of practice meeting was held with other schools from across Victoria. There were three clear messages that came from this meeting around the teaching of the school values, creating a handbook for all staff and how we develop data to monitor staff confidence.

From Term 2, we will have a focus on a specific school value which will link to the learning happening across the school. Over a two-week period, we will be encouraging staff to focus on teaching a specific expectation from the school matrix that links to the value on focus.

The value for each term will be: Term 2: Respect, Term 3: Working Together, Term 4: Learning. As we go through the year, we will keep you updated with the focus for the fortnight.


## How we work

- Support classrooms to support students' receptive and expressive communication.
- Support safe mealtime practices for students with swallowing concerns.
- Support delivery of literacy programs within the classroom.

### Supporting communication

- We work with classroom teams to implement communication systems into classrooms to allow students who are non-speaking or do not rely on their speech access to communication.
- We encourage staff to model language for a variety of communication functions (greetings, comments, asking questions, telling stories) throughout the day- not just requesting!
- Model social language e.g., "I like it", "That's funny", "This
  is fun", as this is the language kids are likely to learn to use
  first.





### How can I help?

- If your child has a communication system at home, speak to your classroom teacher about how we can support it's use at school. PODD and Proloquo2Go are two of the main systems we use at school but not the only two!
- Model language for your child at home as often as possible for a range of communication functions this will help them learn to use their system in all environments.
