

# Curriculum update

Dear Families,

This is an exciting year as next term the Olympic and Paralympic Games will take place in Paris! The primary learning centres have been working on preparations towards completing in our own WPS Olympic Games which the Specialist Team are planning and will take place in term 3. In term 1 classes investigated their strengths and talents and were encouraged to recognise that everyone has different talents and that we cannot all be good at the same things. This term students have been learning about how they can take care of their bodies and minds just as the Olympians and Paralympians do. Classes have investigated how healthy eating and exercise ensures a healthy body. In promoting how to take of their minds the concept of resilience has been explored with students engaging in books that convey the message of never giving up.

Staff have used these topics as authentic reasons for students to read and write. In group 13, the class participated in the shared reading of a book called 'I Can Do It'. After completing the reading had lots of fun participating in personalised experiences to explore their talents such as dancing, playing soccer and basketball, climbing, and counting. This provided the students with experiences that they could write about, and they worked together in a 'Predictable Chart Writing' activity. Predictable Chart Writing is a literacy strategy which has been identified as an effective tool by the Comprehensive Literacy for All experts. Predictable Chart Writing follows a specific structure which uses the concept of repetition with variety to improve students reading and writing skills.

We are so looking forward to sharing our investigations into the Olympic Games with families next term!

As wellbeing coordinators, Paige, Jamie and Sam all work closely with staff, students and families to ensure connections to external services, provide family support, classroom observations, and social and emotional support on an individual basis or as part of a small group. Paige, Jamie and Sam also support with wellbeing activities across all four campuses and provide professional learning to staff.

## Child Safe Standards

As a school, there are eleven child safe standards that we are mandated to adhere to. Over the upcoming newsletters I will share further details with you about the standards. Sharing this information with you all fits within Child Safety Standard 4: Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing. The Protect poster, helps to explain how keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility. These are on display across all campuses for all staff and visitors to see.

All members of staff in school have a duty to take reasonable steps to protect children in our care. There are four critical actions that we have to take when responding to an incident, disclosure or suspicion of child abuse. These four actions include responding to an emergency, reporting to authorities, contacting parents/carers and providing ongoing support.

### WHAT IS PROLOQUO2GO?

- Symbol based, speech generating iPad application




### WHO USES PROLOQUO2GO?

- Non-speaking children and adults
- People who cannot always rely on their spoken language to communicate
- Communication partners of people who are non-speaking



### GETTING STARTED WITH PROLOQUO2GO

- Ensure the system is always available, everywhere
- Practise using the system to become more familiar with the set up
- Model language kids are likely to use: the CHAT folder is great for this!
- Acknowledge all communication attempts even if it is not immediately obvious how the selection relates to the interaction



### MORE QUESTIONS?

Talk to your child's classroom teacher or school speech pathologist about how communication systems are used at WPS to support student communication.
