



Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Survey

Dear Parents.

We want our Parents/Caregivers/Guardians to tell us what they think!

Our school is again conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of family's perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, student engagement and experiences of remote and flexible learning, Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year, the Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion survey will be conducted from Monday 29th July – Friday August 30th.

The survey will be conducted online, it only takes 20 minutes to complete. The survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek. Survey links will be shared by teachers on Seesaw and Compass.

Survey results will be shared with the parent community later this year through our annual reporting communication and newsletters. Last year we used the survey results to plan inform our communication protocols between school and home, improve school climate and improve student engagement and experiences of remote and flexible learning.
