Warringa Crescent Update




Our students have been strengthening their Science Inquiry skills in Predict, Observe, and Explain with exciting hands-on experiments! This fortnight, they explored how heat transforms corn kernels into popcorn—a tasty treat they enjoyed after their observations and discussions.

In Maths, students have been building their counting skills through engaging addition and subtraction activities. Using concrete items like frogs and popcorn from our class texts, students practiced adding to and taking away from collections in a fun, hands-on way.




Important Information – Bus Transportation – Moving Houses
