Polly Parade News

The past few weeks have been filled with exciting learning experiences at Polly Parade Campus!

As part of our 'Everyone Belongs' inquiry topic, students have been exploring their individual interests by answering the questions: 'What activities do I like?' and 'Where do I like to go?' To support this, they have engaged with texts such as 'Some Boys' and 'Some Girls' and participated in hands-on experiences that relate to everyday life. Exploring different places and activities around the school has helped students reflect on their preferences, and classroom staff have been incorporating these insights into their classrooms and daily planners to make learning even more meaningful.

In Science, our focus on 'Chemical Science' has encouraged students to develop their skills in predicting, observing, and explaining. They have been investigating cause and effect through exciting sensory-rich experiments, including making playdough (a great tool for self-regulation), creating "fireworks in a glass," and even baking mug cakes!

Maths learning has also been linked to our inquiry focus, with students collecting and graphing data about their personal interests. By counting and comparing responses, they have discovered which activities are most popular in their classrooms.

Our school mascot, 'Lizzie the Lizard', has been inspiring students to be great learners! This term, we have been focusing on key school expectations such as "We come to school every day" and "We use the iPad to learn." Students have explored these expectations through role play, video modelling, and songs, helping them build positive learning habits.

Following our recent Curriculum Day, where all staff participated in a valuable AAC (Augmentative and Alternative Communication) workshop, we have already seen wonderful progress in students' use of their communication systems throughout the school. Our goal is to ensure that students have access to their communication tools "everywhere, all the time", and it has been fantastic to see this in action.

Lastly, we had a very exciting visit from a professional photographer, who captured incredible moments of teaching and learning across our wonderful school.
