To conclude our 'Everyone Belongs' inquiry, students have been exploring the question: "What helps my body?" They have been reading and writing about different emotions, how their bodies feel, and the tools that help them feel good. To celebrate their learning, classrooms will be sharing videos of their inquiry journeys and successes at our upcoming campus assembly next week.

In Maths, students have been developing their skills in counting, sorting, and comparing collections. They have also been graphing and comparing their personal interests on a pictograph in response to questions about their favourite locations, activities, and sports.

Our school mascot, Lizzie the Lizard, has continued to inspire students to be great learners! Students have been earning SWPBS tokens for demonstrating our school values, which they can use at the campus shop. Lessons have focused on important learning expectations, including coming to school every day, being sun smart, doing our best, and using the iPad to learn and share.

Through our Respectful Relationships lessons, students have been learning about different emotional states and how their bodies respond to various feelings. This has helped them build self-awareness and develop strategies to manage different emotions effectively.

Science has been full of hands-on, cause-and-effect experiments, sparking curiosity and excitement in the classroom! Students have explored chemical reactions through activities like exploding balloons with bi-carb soda, making marshmallow slime, and mixing colours to observe changes.

This term, we were also thrilled to continue Howard's Creative Dance workshops and begin the Story Hub program, where students are learning to bring their stories to life through writing. These exciting programs will continue into Term 2.
