

Curriculum Update

Dear Families,

This term has seen staff participating in a great deal of professional learning. We began the term with a visit from our Comprehensive Literacy Instruction consultants, Jane Farrall and Helen Tainsh. Jane and Helen worked with staff in classrooms with their students to model the implementation of literacy strategies that have been identified to suit the student at their learning point of need. This was then followed up by after school sessions run by the consultants to improve staff knowledge and understanding of these strategies.













The learning for staff continued on curriculum day with Educational Support staff in the primary learning areas working with our Allied Health Team to further improve their understanding of how to support students to improve their literacy skills. Primary learning area teachers spent the morning working with educational consultant Andrea Hillbrick on how the Victorian Teaching and Learning Model (VTLM) can be used to improve their teaching of mathematics. All staff in the secondary learning areas participated in a workshop on the use of Restorative Practice and how this can be used to support students' social and emotional learning.

Teachers have started to prepare students' mid year reports which will be shared with families on Compass on the 27th of June. SSG's provide families with the opportunity to discuss student's learning with staff in more detail. SSG Week will take place from Monday 30 June to Thursday 3 July. There will later bookings available on Tuesday 1 July which is SSG Evening. Bookings for SSG's will be open to families on Compass on Tuesday 10 June.
