STEAM update

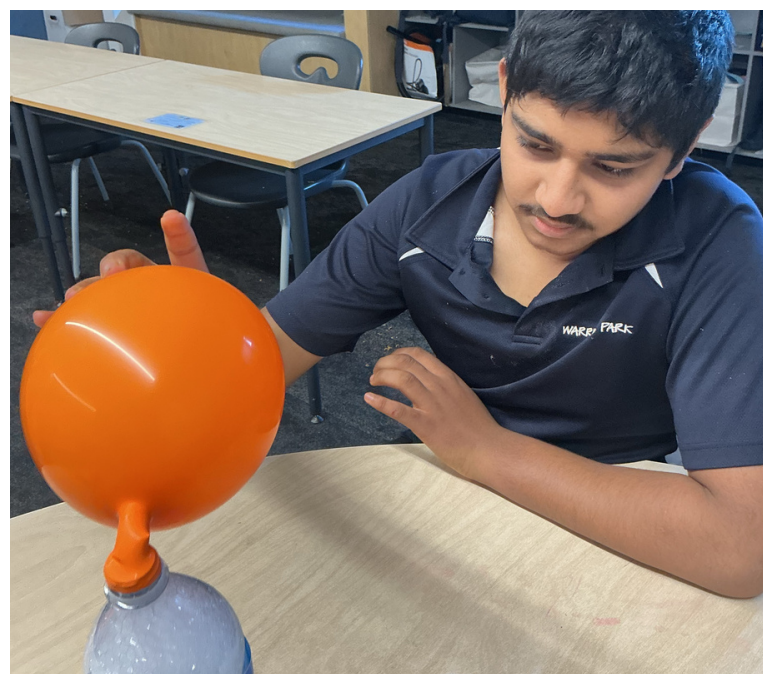
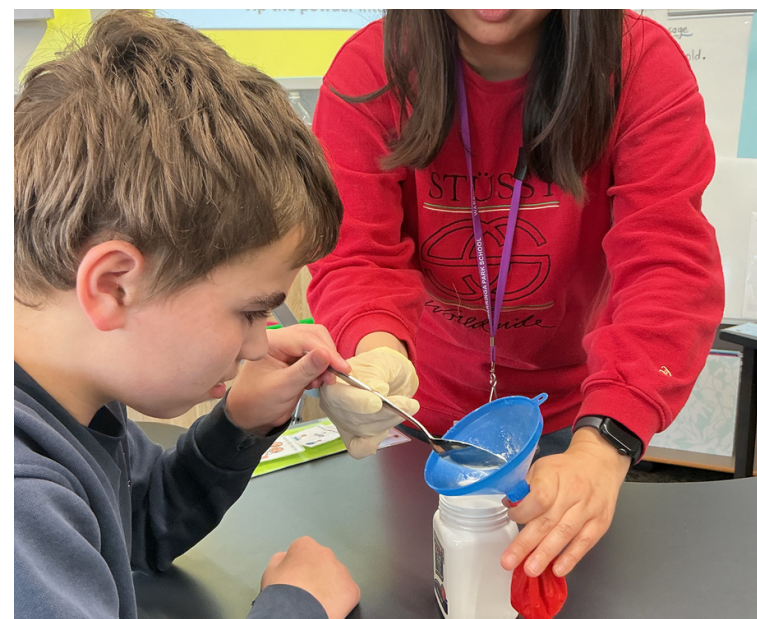
During STEAM, students at Cayleys and Bethany Road have been diving into the exciting world of chemistry through hands-on experiments that spark curiosity, wonder and discovery!

The students took part in the Coke and Mentos experiment, as students watched in amazement when the Mentos triggered an explosive fizzing eruption. With magnifying glasses in hand, the students closely examined the surface of a Mentos and discovered its tiny holes and rough texture. This helped them understand how these features give carbon dioxide bubbles the perfect places to form rapidly—creating a spectacular burst of fizz right before their eyes!

The students also explored the vinegar and balloon experiment, where students explored how mixing vinegar with another substance produces carbon dioxide gas. As the gas was released, it filled and expanded the balloon, giving students a fun and unforgettable visual of a chemical reaction in action.

School Bus Safety Reminders

To help keep all students safe, please remember:

- If your child is not an independent traveller, a parent or authorised carer must be waiting at the bus door to collect them at their bus stop.
- Bus staff cannot leave the bus to walk a student across the road or to another location. Parents and carers must collect their child directly from the bus.
- Food and drinks are not allowed on school buses. This helps keep all students safe by reducing the risk of choking and allergic reactions.

Thank you for helping us keep our students safe while travelling to and from school.

Please be aware that a change of address may affect your child's eligibility for bus access if the new address is outside the Warringa Park School zone.
